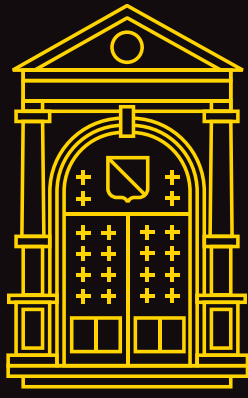

RESEARCH PARADE

Friday the 26th of February marked the date of the very first Research Parade, a student initiative aiming to change the relationship status of research and education. The opening talk was provided by prof. dr. Bram Orobio de Castro, telling us about his research using experimental procedures to study causal mechanisms involved in the initiation and maintenance of behaviour problems. In addition he told us how this knowledge could be used to improve interventions and to conduct randomized trials of their effectiveness to reduce disruptive behaviour problems. During the following workshops, students were introduced

to the varying side of conducting research, with topics varying from 'Radicalization and social justice' to 'the application of neuroscientific knowledge in solving social problems'. Along with dr. Jaap Bos, honours students Stefan Vermeent and Jan Schulpen organized a workshop devoted to the subject of the gray areas within research ethics.

By the end of the day both students and university teachers participated in a plenary debate, after which they joined each other for some drinks while looking back on a very educational and successful day!

Keeping an important secret to yourself can have a negative impact on your physical- and mental health. Keeping a secret can protect you against unwanted responses but it can be inhibiting as well.
